### Thayne Town Council Meeting

April 19, 2018

# Approval of March 15, 2018 Council Meeting and Executive Session Minutes and Adoption of Agenda as finalized with changes.

#### **Sherri Merritt-Thayne Ambulance**

- Sherri stated that the Thayne Ambulance Service has been looking into purchasing a new ambulance for the service. This ambulance is a demo so it is offered at a reduced price due to having mileage. This 2017 ambulance has new safety features to help keep the patient and the crew safer. The total cost with the upgrades will be \$158,928.00. The Thayne Ambulance Service is asking for the Town's support and approval for this purchase. Let the record show that the Thayne Town Council is in support of the purchase of the new ambulance.
- Merritt gave the run report for to date calls and stated that the intermediate class is still going well.

# **Carli Jensen-Daughters of Utah Pioneers**

• Carli addressed the Town Council with the July 4<sup>th</sup> celebration events. Jensen stated that the 2018 Grand Marshall will be Gordon White and the 2018 theme is God Bless America, Land That I Love. The DUP is planning to have a patriotic music festival this year to replace the softball games. The parade water safe zones were discussed along with child safety during the parade.

# **Dee Aullman**

• Dee Aullman addressed the Town Council with concerns regarding the North boundary of the sewer lagoon property. Currently the chain link fence on the North is approximately 10ft onto the Aullman's property. The Aullman family is trying to research for deeds and meeting minutes to correctly address the issue. Mayor Lainhart stated that he had the same issue with his property and that the Town of Thayne allowed him to relocate the fence to the correct boundary line but he had to pay for the total cost. The issue with relocating the North chain link fence is that to backfill the west corner would be very costly. Dee Aullman and Mayor Lainhart agreed that the property

line is not accurate. Mayor Lainhart proposed that the Town of Thayne purchase the 10ft of property that is encroached on in a quick claim deed sale at the same cost as the initial property purchase. Dee Aullman asked for any meeting minutes where the said property was discussed and copies of the Flat Creek test records. The Town agreed to provide those documents.

### **Ross Myers**

- Mr. Myers brought to the Town Council his concerns of Wild Bills Food Truck. Ross stated that the summer and fall months are crucial to his business and other restaurant businesses in town to allow them to remain open through winter. Myers stated that he has no resentment towards the burger truck but he feels that it is unfair to those businesses that work all year round. Ross feels as though the Town of Thayne should restrict the amount of time a mobile vender can remain in one spot.
- Mayor Lainhart stated that the Town Council will visit with the food truck owners prior
  to the renewal of Wild Bill's business license and that the Council will also look into
  other municipalities ordinances regarding mobile food venders. Lainhart feels as though
  permanent businesses deserve protection.

#### **Sunrise Engineering-Robert Hood**

- Wyoming Capital Construction Program
  - Robert Hood wanted to make the Town Council aware of a new loan program for infrastructure including streets. There is currently \$400 million available at a 1% interest rate for 5 year loans or 2.5% interest rate for 25 year loans.
- Thayne Storage Tank Project
  - Land survey and title commitment is complete; Kevin Voyles is currently working on legal issues with the title company.
  - Wyoming Water Development Commission has reviews the draft drawings and there is a 50% design meeting scheduled for Monday April 23, 2018/
- North Waterline Replacement Project Update
  - Kevin Voyles still working on finalizing easements.
- Wright and Van Noy Sidewalks Project
  - Currently working on public comment requirements. The Town Council discussed and decided to hold a public hearing regarding the project.

  - Still on hold for the District. Hopeful that the department can start acquiring signatures mid-summer.

# **Councilman Woolley**

- Cutter Racing Museum
  - Councilmen Woolley stated that the Thayne Cutter Racing Museum is now open. Woolley stated that he would like to have roads signs on either side of town directing traffic to the museum. Councilman Woolley mentioned that he would like to leave the lights on in the museum so that people could easily see in until we have established set hours that it will be open. Woolley proposed the idea of having a sled available for families to take pictures on. Councilman Woolley also asked for the Councils input on having funds budgeted for the Cutter Racing Museum for maintenance and repairs.
- Street Report
  - Woolley stated that he has a contractor to repair the curb and gutter on Hemmert Street.

# **Mayor Lainhart**

- Mayor Lainhart mentioned to the Council that the Town still has \$21,454.00 currently available from the Thayne Business Park Grant that has to be used before July 2018.
